## MESSAGE FROM THE 2021 PRESIDENT



It was a year of reconnection for AWT. After a year apart, AWT was able to hold a Technical Training Seminar in Annapolis, plus the Business Owners Meeting and Annual Convention and Exposition in Providence, Rhode Island. It was refreshing to reengage with colleagues! During 2020 and 2021, as AWT navigated the pandemic, we also stayed focused on our strategic plan.

The AWT strategic plan defines and drives our mission and has been responsible for some of our most exciting developments, especially in recent years. There are four major outcomes in the strategic plan.

#### Outcome 1

### **Education and Training**

This area continues to be strong thanks to the great work of our volunteers. Visit the Members Only page on the website to make sure you are taking advantage of all of the available member benefits.

AWT is committed to providing you with easy access to education. Our goal is to offer a vast array of educational opportunities through in-person events and online training. In addition, the AWT board recognizes the need to educate the next generation of water treatment professionals. In 2021, we were able to finish the Introduction to Water Treatment online modules as well as the Water Treatment Troubleshooting videos. These resources, offered free to members, are aimed at professionals new to the field.

#### Outcome 2

### Member and Industry Advocate

Advocacy is an area of focus for AWT as we become more proactive in causes affecting our industry and other water issues, both domestic and global. AWT also continues its path to becoming the voice of the water treatment industry by working closely with ASHRAE, CTI, IWC, the EPA, the CDC, and other organizations.

#### **Outcome 3**

### An Engaged Membership

In 2021, AWT's focus was on Amplify AWT. This initiative came about when AWT began exploring options for addressing concerns regarding the sustainability and health of the association. In short, current market forces, along with AWT's structure, are inhibiting growth that would lead to long-term sustainability. A task force was established to evaluate potential changes we could make. The two current proposals are to change the cap on water treatment company members to 500 employees or fewer and to add an individual membership category. We plan to continue the discussions with members around these important topics in 2022, with the culmination of the work being a bylaws vote.

#### Outcome 4

## Charity

Pure Water for the World is a charitable organization dedicated to improving the health and livelihood of children and families living in Haiti and Honduras by establishing sustainable safe water, hygiene, and sanitation solutions. Representatives from Pure Water for the World are very involved in our efforts and are so appreciative and supportive of our fundraising and the thousands of dollars of aid received from your generous contributions. In 2021, AWT members raised over \$50,000 for Pure Water for the World.

In closing, I'd like to thank my fellow AWT board members, committee chairs, committee participants, and staff for their unrelenting support during my presidency. I'd also like to thank the AWT members for their continued involvement and their belief in this great organization. Thank you, and carry on being great ambassadors for our profession!




